Recommend voting **no** on Measure V.

We've learned a lot from taking care

On June 7, Mendocino County will decide on Measure V.

Listen to forest and fire experts and you'll hear what the passage of Measure V will mean:

- Progress in forest and aquatic habitat restoration delayed.
- Steps to improve the conifer balance in woodlands deferred.
- Our ability to contribute to communities permanently restricted.

By contrast, a **no** vote will preserve our ability to work together. Protecting more than 300+ local and family wage jobs.

We're not alone in this viewpoint:

- A majority of the Board of Supervisors rejected the ideas behind Measure V.
- Four respected forest and fire experts stated a vote against V is a vote for fire safety.

Simply because it will mean short-sighted governmental mandates.
